## **Sports Premium Funding Report 2016/17**

## 2016/17 Sports Premium Funding Expenditure:

PE and sport play a very important part in the life of Ore Village Primary Academy. We believe that physical education and sport contribute to the holistic development of young people and through participation in sport and physical education, young people learn more about key values such as teamwork, fair play and respect for themselves and others.

There is significant evidence to show the positive effects of sport and exercise on children's physical health, growth and development. Furthermore, sport also provides a healthy environment for young people to learn how to deal with competition and cope with both winning and losing.

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding (Sport Premium) for physical education (PE) and sport to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision in schools. We are using the Sports Premium in the following ways.

- Joining the Hastings and Rother School Games Partnership (HRSGP) which provides assistance in raising quality and breadth of PE and sport provision.
- Professional development training to raise competence and confidence in teaching of PE and sport.
- Employing external sports coaches to run clubs and increase pupils' participation in physical activity.
- Participating in regular sports tournaments, festivals and competitions in our cluster group and HRSGP
- Providing games activities during lunch breaks.
- Developing young playground sports leaders in Key Stage 2 through the partnership with HRGSP.
- Buying quality assured materials and resources for PE and sport.

Contribution to good quality teaching in PE	£1,000	The PE subject lead will be released to monitor the teaching of PE across the school through team teaching and offering ideas. They will also attend cluster groups with HASLA in order to identify further training needs and development opportunities.
Sports Coaching	£3,000	We aim to regularly engage sports coaches from professional bodies including Brighton and Hove Albion Football Club and East Sussex County Cricket Club. Students' understanding of an unfamiliar sport enhances their work in school; increased participation by girls; boys more academically engaged and successful in school; promote more productive play.
Funding lunchtime sports clubs	£3,600	A trained sport and play coach will be employed to run a sports club at lunchtimes in KS2. This member of staff will coach and train children and

		liaise directly with the PE lead to identify talent and potential.
Funding after school sports clubs	£2,000	Kits will be purchased for the football and netball teams as well as running shirts for the athletics team. New equipment will be purchased included spare boots and shin guards in order that all children have access to sports regardless of the costs involved. This will lead to students' social interaction skills developed; teamwork being enhanced; behaviours for learning improved.

## Evaluation and sustainable improvement from sport premium

**Evaluation Summary** - As a result of the Sports Premium funding being used effectively, there has been a positive impact on teachers and children. More children are participating and engaging with a range of different sporting activities. Teachers are now more confident to offer a more varied range of extra-curricula sporting activities as well as high quality PE teaching during curriculum time.

Teachers are now comfortable to ask questions and receive support either from external coaches or from the PE coordinator and teachers are improving their practice as a result of this. Equipment and kits have helped to raise the profile of PE and Sport and promote active lifestyles. This should remain as an objective so that parents, children and teachers understand the importance of healthy lifestyle choices (including activity and healthy eating) and reduce obesity levels. Sport premium will continue to be used to develop teacher's understanding of PE outcomes and progression which will in turn will improve the quality of teaching and ensure so that all pupils are making expected or better than expected progress in PE. In order to move the school forward with healthy lifestyles, we have used part of the sport premium to help set up a daily 'Healthy snack tuck shop'.

Contribution to good quality teaching in PE	Estimated £1,000 Actual £1,000	We have seen an increase in confidence in the staff members who needed and received support from the Hastings Cluster so far as they work alongside each other during PE sessions. When this has not been possible, other strategies were employed (such as better use of PPA timetables) to ensure that teaching and learning is at a higher standard in all classes.
Sports Coaching	Estimated £3,000 Actual £3,000	We have had sports coaches from Brighton & Hove Albion, Sussex Cricket Club and Ore Cricket Club visit the school. Sports Premium funding has enabled us to pay for membership of the Hastings and Rother Sports Network which organise sports competitions and this has increased the % of girls taking part in team games. The quality of provision has also improved as a result of the PE Specialists working with teachers more closely.
Funding lunchtime sports clubs	Estimated £3,600 Actual £3,600	A sports coach has been working with targeted groups of pupils and whole phase groups to deliver games, team building activities and sports at playtimes. This has contributed to a 52% decrease in 'Red Card' incidents across the school from Term 1 to Term 6.
Funding after school sports clubs	Estimated £2,000 Actual £2,000	A new football and athletics strip have been purchased and OVPA teams now regularly represent the school in local sports

		tournaments. Year 5 and 6 also took part in the TKAT games at the Allianz Arena and sports premium was used to fund coaches to travel to the venue.
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With an increase in Sports Premium for the academic year 2017/18, there is a huge opportunity to have a large impact on children's lifestyles and the provision and teaching of PE in school. The school has also applied for a Healthy Eating Grant of £7,000 which will be used in conjunction with the sports premium to have maximum impact.

We want to continue to broaden the opportunities available for pupils before school, during playtimes and afterschool to continue to:

- engage all pupils in activity;
- reduce obesity levels;
- increase self-discipline, self-determination and self-confidence;
- develop children's ability to live healthy lifestyles and make active and healthy choices;
- improve children's holistic wellbeing.
