Sports Premium Funding Report 2017/18

2017/18 Sports Premium Funding Expenditure:

PE and sport play a very important part in the life of Ore Village Primary Academy. We believe that physical education and sport contribute to the holistic development of young people and through participation in sport and physical education, young people learn more about key values such as teamwork, fair play and respect for themselves and others.

There is significant evidence to show the positive effects of sport and exercise on children's physical health, growth and development. Furthermore, sport also provides a healthy environment for young people to learn how to deal with competition and cope with both winning and losing.

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding (Sport Premium) for physical education (PE) and sport to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision in schools. We are using the Sports Premium in the following ways.

- Joining the Hastings and Rother School Games Partnership (HRSGP) which provides assistance in raising quality and breadth of PE and sport provision.
- Professional development training to raise competence and confidence in teaching of PE and sport.
- Employing external sports coaches to run clubs and increase pupils' participation in physical activity.
- Participating in regular sports tournaments, festivals and competitions in our cluster group and HRSGP
- Providing games activities during lunch breaks.
- Developing young playground sports leaders in Key Stage 2 through the partnership with HRGSP.
- Buying quality assured materials and resources for PE and sport.

- To improve the provision of PE at Ore Village Primary Academy
- PE Provision to be judged as good by external monitoring
- Broaden the sporting opportunities and experiences available to pupils
- To develop a love of sport and physical activity
- To continue to broaden the opportunities available for pupils before school, during playtimes and afterschool to continue to:
- To engage more pupils in after school sporting activities
- To increase self-discipline, self-determination and self-confidence
- To develop children's ability to live healthy lifestyles and make active and healthy choices
- To improve children's holistic wellbeing.

Strategy	Cost	Expected Impact
Membership of Hastings and Rother District Sports Partnership	£1540	The PE subject lead to attend cluster groups with HASLA in order to identify further training needs and development opportunities. This will result in CPD sessions being offered to all staff through the partnership in order to support the development of PE teaching. The school to enter

		a greater number of sports competitions to develop teamwork and competitive sportsmanship.
Funding lunchtime sports clubs	£3,600	A trained sports coach to be employed to run a sports club at lunchtimes in KS2. This will result in a greater number of children being coached in a range of sports activities. This will enable greater participation in physical sports activities
PE release time to model PE teaching and attend CPD sessions	£1,000	The PE lead will be released to model the teaching of PE to other year groups (with a focus on new teachers). This will result in further consistency in the standard of PE and sports teaching across the school. Staff confidence should increase through the year. This will be measured through a staff survey.
Swimming coach and lesson costs	£5,400	As a school with a strong coastal connection, we offer swimming to Year 3 and 4 classes for the year to ensure they leave the school as competent swimmers. We employ a specialist swimming teacher to provide these lessons and we pay the transportation costs. Every child to be able to swim 25 metres.
PE equipment	£500	Update and replace equipment that has undergone wear and tear (footballs, netballs, tag rugby balls, gymnastics mats and athletics equipment). Playtime sports equipment and play leader bibs to be purchased. This will enable high quality lessons to be taught and the promotion of physical activity at break and lunchtimes.
Access to HASLA grounds	£7000	To provide an access gate to enable entry to HASLA grounds directly from our grounds in order to use superior facilities and generate further opportunities for shared resources. This would be at the rear of the school playing field which backs onto the HASLA playing field.
To develop a Dance/Drama studio including Ecophon sound absorption panels	£4000	To raise the profile of Dance through structured CPD opportunities led by PE/Sports lead teacher. Classes to use this purpose built space regularly with a long-term view of hiring it to the local community.
